Under the U.S. DSCSA, pharmaceutical and healthcare companies are required to electronically exchange item-level product traceability information. This creates new logistical challenges for drop shipments, 340B, and returns, leaving many in the industry asking questions like:

- How do manufacturers drop shipping product to dispensers send serialized T2 data electronically if they don't have a direct commercial relationship?
- Who should provide contract pharmacies with the data needed for receiving 340B product—the covered entity or the distributor?
